Other discussion for movement on action items 	 By December 31, 2022, LC will see a decrease in adult tobacco use (20% or below will be current smokers) and youth tobacco use (23% or below vaping and 10% or below smoking traditional tobacco). a. Sarah Tille provided an update of the work of the Vaping Task Force. The LCADA Way has assisted in compiling documents for a toolkit/schools around vaping. Tobacco quit line numbers are higher this year than last. The group agreed to add tobacco quit line data to measures of success for this goal. b. Christine Robinson shared that Communities That Care will be surveying students again this fall regarding substance abuse use and perceptions. The details have yet to be determined due to the uncertainties around COVID-19. c. ST also shared LCPH is putting out materials related to the risks related to smoking and COVID-19. d. She shared that when COVID-19 restrictions lift, there will be a kick-off meeting to get more people involved and chair the workgroups. b. SR provided a detailed data update including information from OD Maps and New World. She spoke to the information that can be gleaned and efforts to make the data more comprehensive. During COVID-19 restrictions, there seems to be an increase in overdoses in Lorain County. Pam Weiland shared that in 2019 961 DAWN kits were distributed and there were 64 known saves from the distribution. c. CR shared that Warm Handoff, Police Assistance Project and the Quick Response teams are still working to connect individuals to treatment and recovery. d. This item was covered in conjunction with the Mental Health CHIP Screening subcommittee e. SR and CR shared that Community Engagement Workgroup continues to meet. f.
