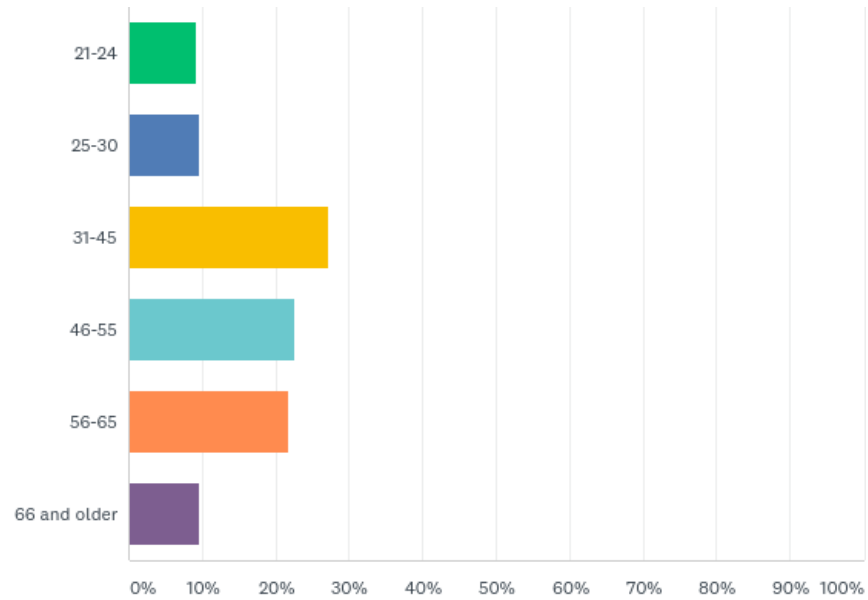

Attitudes and beliefs in regard to underage alcohol use

- 3 out of 4 (75%) parents/adult believe drinking by teens/young adults is never a good thing.
- Nearly 1 out of 5 believe drinking by teens/young adults under supervision of his/her parents is okay.

Your rule for your teen/young adult about drinking alcoholic beverages

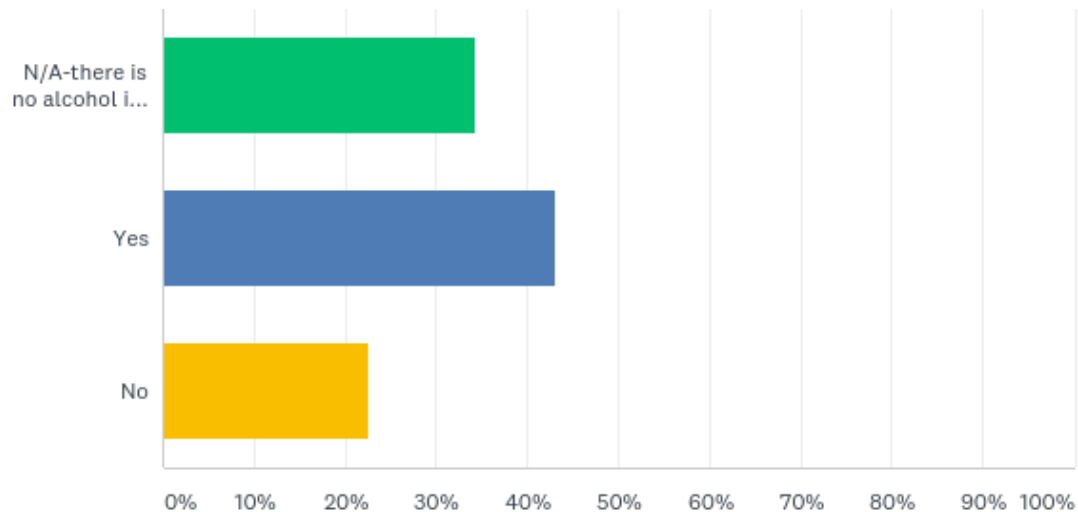
Norms question-disparity between perception and reality?

If you take out the respondents who do not have children, then about 71% of respondents do not allow their children to drink, 18% allow sips at special occasions, and 8.5% allow their teens to drink when only family is present. Beliefs and actions roughly consistent.

I allow my teen/young adult to drink a few sips at religious ceremonies or on special occasions.	14.01% 65
I sometimes allow my teen/young adult to have a drink when only family is present.	6.68% 31
I sometimes allow my teen/young adult to drink with friends when an adult is present to supervise.	1.72% 8
I allow my teen/young adult to drink with friends, even when an adult is not present.	0.65% 3
I do not have children.	21.12% 98

Do you actively monitor or take stock of any alcohol present in your home?

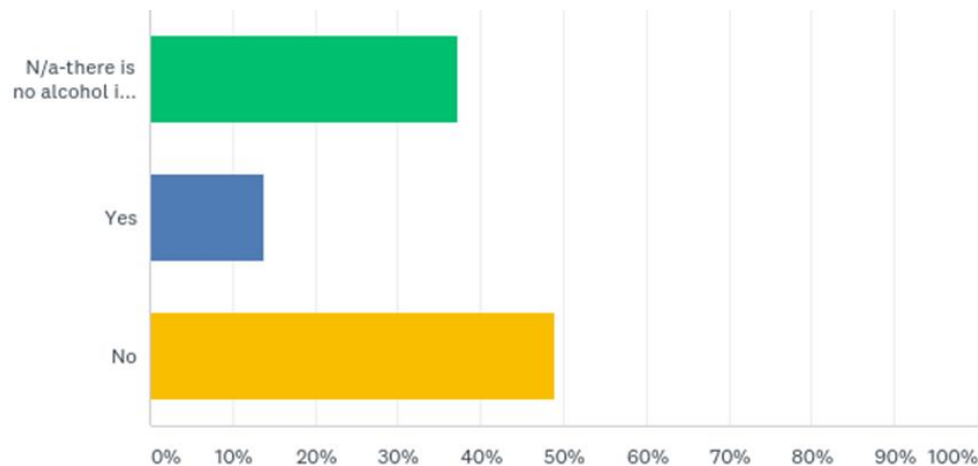
Of those who have alcohol in their home, 2 out of 3 (65.57%) actively monitor the alcohol in their home.

Do you lock up or secure any alcohol present in your home?

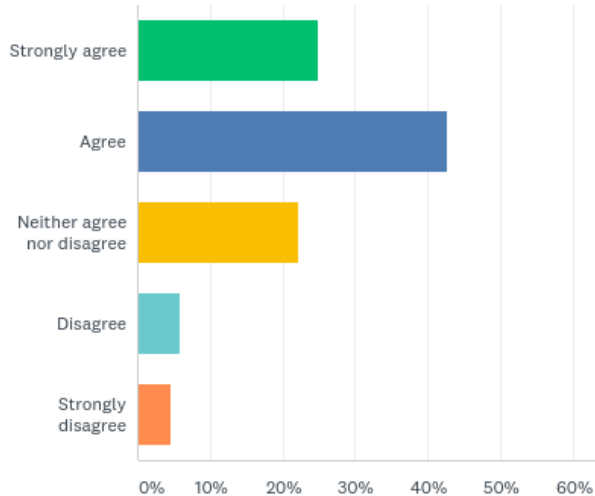
Of those who have alcohol in their home, just over 1 in 5 (22%) lock up or secure alcohol in their home.

Too many parents/adults either provide alcohol for their children or turn a blind eye to underage drinking.

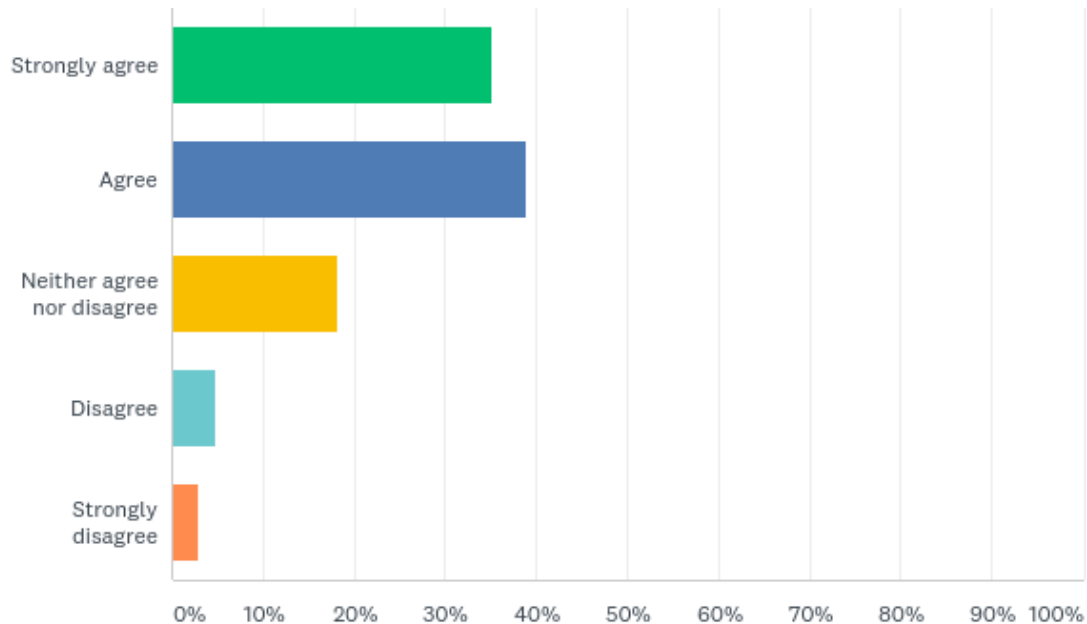
- 2 out of 3 parents/adults “agree” or “strongly agree” (67.53%)
- Nearly 1 out of 5 parents (22.15%) neither agree or disagree
- 10.32% disagree/strongly disagree

Many parents/adults set a bad example for their children by their own excessive or unhealthy alcohol use.

- Nearly 3 out of 4 parents/adults “agree” or “strongly agree” (74.08%)
- Neither agree or disagree (18.14%)
- Disagree or strongly disagree (7.77%)



Actions you would take if you became aware that another parent/adult was allowing teens/young adults (other than their own child) to drink at their home (multiple responses allowed)

- About half of respondents (45% and 55% respectively) would call and talk to the parent and prohibit their child from going to that home
- About one quarter 25.22% would
- report it to the local police

Attitudes and beliefs in regard to marijuana and other illegal drug use among teens/young adults

87% of parents/adults think any marijuana use by teens/young adults is never a good thing

Use of marijuana by teens/young adults is never a good thing.	87.01%	402
Occasional use of marijuana by teens/young adults under supervision of his/her parents is okay.	5.41%	25
Occasional use of marijuana by teens/young adults under supervision of a friend's parents is okay.	0.43%	2
Occasional use of marijuana by teens/young adults without adult supervision is okay as long as there is no driving involved.	3.46%	16
Any type of marijuana use by teens/young adults is okay.	3.68%	17

Too many parents/adults turn a blind eye to youth marijuana use.

- Over 2 out of 3 parents/adults “agree” or “strongly agree” (68.17%)
- 20.86% neither agree or disagree
- 10.97% “disagree” or “strongly disagree”

Degree of Influence over teen's decision to use

82% of parents/adults think they have “great” or “some” influence over their teen/young adult's decision about whether to use alcohol, tobacco, marijuana or other drugs
